Remove Ego from design
When design work is the result of 2+ people - it's design from the TEAM rather than from an individual.
This makes it WAY easier to look at more objectively and identify opportunities to improve.

Hybrid Standups

Top tips for Hybrid Stand-ups with Butter!

- Use the comments feature to share a GIF of how you're feeling on the stand-up
- Write notes in a shared Google Doc, so you can always circulate and share after - also take to an action and a deadline
- Pull a face!
- React sound as they mic drop
- And use the "I'm passing to..."
- Consider using polls to share an update.
